1. Marvin Yoder, Galena City Manager, made the following comments:
 - a. A potential source of rock for this project is Mueller Mountain. Access to that site would be via ice road that may cross two native allotments and village corporation (Gana A'Yoo) land. Doyon owns the subsurface rights at Mueller Mountain.
 - b. The City of Galena is preparing to build a senior assisted living facility adjacent to the project site. The successful bidder may want to look at those plans. Coordination may be required.
 - c. Be aware that a fuel barge will tie up at the project site several times during the summer.
2. Tom Johnson of DOT made the following comment:

- a. DOT maintains the road to the transmission site, which could be part of the access to Mueller Mountain. Tom does not remove all the snow. The road is not much wider than 24 feet. There are some blind corners, although he plans to brush the road this summer. Weight is not a problem in the winter. If the successful bidder does use the road, some coordination with DOT may be required. Be aware that the airport is DOT's priority; it may take a couple of days after a snowfall until Tom clears the road to the transmission site.
3. The contractors in attendance had the following comments and questions:
 - a. Twin Peaks suggested that the Corps obtain access rights to Mueller Mountain to level the playing field amongst the bidders. Brice and Cruz Construction had the same suggestion. The Corps agreed to consider this request. At a minimum, the Corps agreed to contact Gana A'Yoo and Tanana Chiefs Conference (TCC) to get contact information for access to village corporation land and native allotments, respectively.
 - b. Brice and Cruz Construction stated that the material from the Yukon River would not meet the specifications for Filter Rock, but it has been used successfully on the previous bank protection projects. In written correspondence Twin Peaks stated that the material specified is not attainable from the local source without enormous cost and risk. They asked if screened rock from the quarry would be acceptable. The Corps agreed to review the specification for Filter Rock.

2. The Corps reviewed the Filter Rock specification and has decided to change it. The specification will be something like, "Filter material shall be well-graded gravel with a minimum of 15% retained on the 1.5-inch sieve and a maximum of 5% passing the two-hundred (#200) sieve." This change will be included in a future amendment. Screened rock from the quarry would be acceptable as long as it meets the new specification.
