6 please refrain from that. Stay out of the red-taped areas,  
7 stay with your group. And then the electrical outside of the  
8 main switch gear is energized at this point in time. We do  
9 have temporary power panels.

10 MR. LARSON: Is the temporary lighting restored back in  
11 the finished areas, in the access areas?

6 MR. HOUX: Overhead welding in the green area, up in  
7 the IBS, and over in the admin area. We're welding on the  
8 kickers in that area right now and there is some.....

9 MR. LARSON: And it's marked down below.

10 MR. HOUX: Yes, it's marked down below and there's a  
11 little bit of miscellaneous metals being welded on in the  
12 patient area. It's pretty well flagged off. Like I say, just


